SUBJECT: Amendment to the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget

Meeting Type & Date: Regular Council Meeting November 21, 2017

Action type:

Public Hearing Resolution

Recommendation:

That Council, by Resolution, authorize an amendment to the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget.

Summary:

Recently, a series of budget reviews were conducted with department heads and the City Manager. Each expenditure line item was reviewed, and in many places, budgeted expenditures were reduced. Revenue line items were reassessed, and some of them were recalculated based on new information, or they were revised to account for actual year-to-date activity. Each vacant position was evaluated, and many were eliminated. The result of those meetings is this proposed amendment to the FY 2018 budget.

The amendment, if approved, would have a positive budgetary impact of \$4,584,110, including \$4,308,721 to the General Fund and \$275,388 to other municipal funds. The proposed changes are summarized throughout this document. Specific changes, by line item, are provided in the attachments.

Overview of General Fund Impacts

General Fund Revenue – Increase budgeted revenues by \$2,305,543 in the following manner:

- Increase Sales Tax budgeted revenue by \$679,904 in recognition of collected sales tax revenues, which have been above budget for the first four months of FY18. This revision of budgeted revenue recognizes the extra revenue collected from July through October, but it does not rely on an assumption that this trend will continue for the rest of the fiscal year.
- Increase Mineral Tax budgeted revenue by \$539,767. State officials have recalculated the distribution of above-the-cap revenues. This budget amendment will recognize the extra revenue due to the city as a result of that recalculation.

- Increase Electrical Franchise Fee budgeted revenue by \$470,416. This would account for six months of enhanced revenue from the anticipated 2% rate increase in the Rocky Mountain Power franchise fee.
- Increase Interdepartmental Revenues by \$287,848. The methodology used to calculate interdepartmental charges should be updated to reflect actual service levels provided by various City departments.
- Increase Property Taxes by \$177,150. The County did not finalize Property Taxes until after the original budget was calculated. This year, the finalized number was greater than the estimate used for the original budget.
- Increase Building Rent by \$116,000. The annual rent payment for the Lenhart Building (135 North Ash Street) was originally budgeted as revenue for the Capital Projects Fund (Fund 30). This amendment would accrue that revenue to the General Fund.
- Other changes total a net revenue increase of \$34,457.

<u>General Fund Expenditures</u> – Decrease General Fund expenditures by \$2,003,179 in the following manner:

- Decrease transfers out to other funds by \$1,016,380
- Increase City Council expenditures by \$91
- Increase City Manager expenditures by \$83,866
- Reduce City Attorney expenditures by \$134,064
- Reduce Municipal Court expenditures by \$63,734
- Increase Finance expenditures by \$141,609
- Reduce Human Resources expenditures by \$97,032
- Reduce Planning expenditures by \$16,447
- Reduce Police expenditures by \$597,537
- Reduce Fire expenditures by \$12,461
- Reduce Code Enforcement expenditures by \$45,167
- Reduce Engineering expenditures by \$115,541
- Increase Streets expenditures by \$16,824
- Reduce Cemetery expenditures by \$23,290
- Reduce Fort Casper expenditures by \$7,048
- Reduce Parks expenditures by \$116,684

A more detailed description of the General Fund expenditure reductions is presented below and on the following pages.

<u>City Council</u> – Decrease net budgeted expenditures by \$91. Reductions would be generated by reducing Survey Services, Programs and Projects, and Council Goals by a total of \$24,067. This would be counteracted by rebudgeting \$23,976 of unspent funding that had been set aside for the Platte River Trails Trust in FY 2017.

<u>City Manager</u> – Increase net budgeted expenditures by \$83,866 in the following manner:

- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$97,372 to fill a new Assistant to the City Manager position. This individual has been transferred from the Engineering Division. This budget increase is mostly offset by the elimination of that individual's original position in Engineering.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$13,506 to account for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

City Attorney – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$134,064 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$129,316 for the elimination of a vacant Assistant City Attorney II position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$4,748 to account for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

<u>Municipal Court</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$63,734 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$52,430 to account for the elimination of a vacant Court Coordinator position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$11,304 to account for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

<u>Finance</u> – Increase net budgeted expenditures by \$141,609 in the following manner:

- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$124,200 to allow for the creation of a new Financial Services Director position. This amount includes non-salary benefits.
- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$70,032 to account for a transfer of the Payroll Technician to the Financial Services Department from the Support Services Department. This change is entirely offset by a decrease in the Human Resources cost center.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$19,531 to account for the elimination of a vacant part time Administrative Tech position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$33,092 to account for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

Human Resources – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$97,032 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$70,032 to account for a transfer of the Payroll Technician to the Financial Services Department from the Support Services Department.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$11,408 to account for the reclassification of an Assistant City Manager to Department Head.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$15,592 to account for the elimination of step increases and the removal of disability buyback.

<u>Planning</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$16,447 to account for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

Police – Decrease net budgeted expenditures by \$597,537 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$330,293 to account for savings from Police Officer positions that were vacant for the first three months of the fiscal year.
- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$106,151 to transfer a portion of the unspent overtime budget from the Variable Services Fund to the General Fund.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$65,696 to account for the elimination of a vacant Criminal Evidence Technician position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$78,960 for the elimination of a vacant Community Service Officer position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$228,739 to account for the removal of step increases and the removal of disability buyback.

Fire – Decrease net budgeted expenditures by \$12,461 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$53,949 for the elimination of a vacant Administrative Support Tech position.
- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$98,729 to transfer a portion of the unspent overtime budget from the Variable Services Fund to the General Fund.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$57,241 for the adjustment of Accrued Leave and Holiday Pay to actual results, and to account for reductions in non-labor spending.

<u>Code Enforcement</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$45,167 to account for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

Engineering – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$115,541 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$93,127 to account for the transfer of a position to City Manager's Office.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$22,414 to account for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

<u>Streets</u> – Increase net budgeted expenditures by \$16,824 in the following manner:

- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$450,000 to account for the Ice Control Supplies budget that has been eliminated from Variable Services Fund.
- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$64,645 to transfer a portion of the unspent overtime budget from the Variable Services Fund to the General Fund.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$89,119 to account for the elimination of a vacant Traffic Supervisor position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$104,531 to account for the transfer of two Equipment Operator II positions to the Refuse Collection Fund.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$64,123 for the elimination of a vacant Equipment Operator II position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$150,000 to account for a reduction in the amount of asphalt that will be purchased this fiscal year.

• Decrease \$90,048 to account for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

<u>Cemetery</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$23,290 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$15,640 for the elimination of a vacant part time Administrative Assistant position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$7,650 for the elimination of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

<u>Fort Caspar</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$7,048 for the removal of step increases and the removal of disability buyback.

<u>Parks</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$116,684 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

General Fund Transfers Out – Net transfers from the General Fund to other funds will be reduced by \$1,016,380. In general, these transfers are the result of expenditure reductions in the funds that are subsidized by the General Fund.

Overview of Impacts to Other Funds

<u>Weed and Pest</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$12,674 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

<u>CDBG</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$4,421 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending. This decrease will be entirely offset by a decrease in transfers in from the General Fund.

Revolving Land – Increase net budgeted revenue by \$354,300 in the following manner:

- Increase anticipated revenue by \$522,000 from the sale of City owned property.
- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$168,000 for demolition work associated with the Plains Furniture Building.
- Decrease other non-labor spending by \$300.

<u>Police Grants</u> - Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$5,051 to account for the removal of step increases and the removal of disability buyback.

<u>Fire Assistance Grants</u> – Increase budgeted revenues by \$30,000 to recognize increased Wildfire reimbursements.

<u>Transit</u> – Decrease budgeted revenues by \$91,606 to account for a reduction in federal grant revenues. This decrease would be entirely offset by an increased transfer in from the General Fund.

MPO - Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$1,772 for the elimination of step increases and the removal of disability buyback. This decrease would be offset by \$177 of reduced transfer in from the General Fund, a decrease of \$1,540 of billable revenue from the federal grant, and \$55 of reduced contributions from the other local member agencies.

Opportunities Fund – Decrease transfers out by \$1,093,580. The original budget called for utilizing these funds to make up for other shortfalls in capital revenue. Those projects have been suspended, pending further review.

<u>Capital Projects</u> – Decrease net budgeted revenue by \$1,017,080 in the following manner:

- Account for the transfer of \$116,000 of building rent income for the Lenhart Building lease (135 North Ash Street). This income will now be recognized in the General Fund.
- Increase budgeted expenses by \$5,000 to renovate the front desk area of the Community Development Department.
- Decrease transfers in from the Opportunities Fund in the amount of \$896,080, to account for various projects that have been suspended and which are now under review.

<u>Capital Equipment</u> – Decrease transfers in from the Opportunities Fund by \$197,500 and decrease budgeted expenditures by \$53,000 to account for the removal of various Light Equipment purchases for the Community Development Department. The Community Development purchases will be postponed until FY19.

<u>Water</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$34,132 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and the recalculation of interdepartmental service charges.

<u>Sewer</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$52,452 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and the recalculation of interdepartmental service charges.

WWTP – Increase net budgeted expenditures by \$55,825 in the following manner:

- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$90,370 to account for increased Interdepartmental charges.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$34,545 for the removal of step increases and the removal of disability buyback.

Refuse Collection – Increase net budgeted expenditures by \$68,672 in the following manner:

- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$104,532 to account for the transfer of two Equipment Operator II positions from the Streets Division to the Solid Waste Division.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$35,860 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and changes to the calculation of interdepartmental services.

<u>Balefill Fund</u> – Increase net budgeted expenditures by \$102,465 in the following manner:

- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$128,326 to account for increased Interdepartmental charges.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$25,861 for the removal of step increases and the removal of disability buyback.

Aquatics – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$89,208 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$78,837 for the elimination of a vacant Recreation Coordinator position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$10,371 for the removal of step increases and the removal of disability buyback.
- Offset the change to budgeted expenditures by decreasing the transfer in from the General Fund.

<u>Golf</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$87,474 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$78,839 to account for the transfer of a Mechanic I position to the Fleet cost center.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$8,635 for the removal of step increases and the removal of disability buyback.

<u>Ice Arena</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$12,619 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, reductions in non-labor spending, and expectations of enhanced concessions revenue. This change would be entirely offset by a \$2,000 increase in projected revenue from enhanced concessions, and a \$14,619 reduction to the transfers in from the General Fund.

Hogadon – Decrease net budgeted expenditures by \$92,518 in the following manner:

- Increase budgeted revenue by \$39,500 to account for anticipated increases in building rentals.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$34,249 for the replacement of an Assistant Superintendent position with a Ski Area Technician position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$18,769 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.
- Offset the change to budgeted expenditures by decreasing the transfer in from the General Fund.

<u>Casper Events Center</u> – Decrease subsidies by \$112,476 based on FY17 performance. This would be entirely offset by a reduction of transfers in from the General Fund.

<u>PSCC</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$126,867 in the following manner:

• Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$47,635 to account for savings from positions that were vacant in the first three months of the fiscal year.

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$65,498 for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.
- Decrease budgeted revenue by \$120,000 to account for reductions in Telephone Service Charge revenues. This reduction in revenue largely offsets the reduction in spending. The remaining reductions in spending are offset by a \$4,151 of reduced contribution from member agencies and a \$2,717 reduction of transfers in from the General Fund.

Water Treatment Plant – Increase net budgeted expenditures by \$90,919 in the following manner:

- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$108,391 to account for changes in Interdepartmental Service charges.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$17,472 for the removal of step increases and removal of disability buyback.

<u>Casper Recreation Center</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$56,766 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$38,975 for the elimination of a vacant Custodial Maintenance Worker position.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$17,791 to account for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.
- This reduction in budgeted expenditures would be entirely offset by a reduction of transfers in from the General Fund.

<u>Fleet</u> – Decrease net budgeted expenditures by \$85,186 in the following manner:

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$84,288 for the elimination of the vacant Fleet Maintenance Manager position.
- Increase budgeted expenditures by \$78,839 to account for the transfer of a Mechanic I position from the Municipal Golf Course.
- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$79,737 to account for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.

<u>IT</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$76,666 in the following manner:

- Decrease \$59,512 for the elimination of a vacant GIS Specialist position.
- Decrease \$17,154 for removal of step increases, removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.
- This reduction in budgeted expenditures would be offset by a \$35,518 reduction of transfers in from the General Fund and a \$41,148 reduction of transfers in from other funds.

<u>Buildings and Grounds</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$49,241 in the following manner:

• Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$43,690 for the elimination of a vacant Custodial Maintenance Worker position.

- Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$5,551 for removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending.
- This decrease in budgeted expenditures would be offset by a \$39,393 reduction of transfers in from the General Fund and a \$9,848 reduction of transfers in from other funds.

<u>Variable Services Fund</u> – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$617,950 and transfer all non-eclipse related funding to Police, Fire, and Streets. This reduction in expenditures would be entirely offset by a reduced transfer in from the General Fund.

Metro Animal Services – Decrease budgeted expenditures by \$44,303 to account for the removal of step increases, the removal of disability buyback, and reductions in non-labor spending. This reduction in expenditures would be offset by a \$2,000 increase to operational revenues, a \$42,223 reduction of transfers in from the General Fund and a \$4,080 reduction in contributions from the other member agencies.

Financial Considerations:

The net impact of the enhancements to budgeted revenues and the reductions in budgeted expenditures will be \$4,584,110 which includes \$4,308,721 of net positive impact to the General Fund directly plus \$275,388 of net positive impact to other municipal funds.

WEEK 3 AT THE CAPITOL

Week 3 at the Capitol continued with the introduction of additional new bills. As of the writing of this report, 273 House Bills, 162 Senate Files, 10 House Joint Resolutions and 11 Senate Joint Resolutions have been introduced. We expect the number of bills to continue to grow until January 29 which is the last day for the House to submit bills; the Senates deadline was January 24.

The WAM Website www.wyomuni.org contains information on all the bills we are tracking and identifies bills that directly and indirectly relate to WAM. The following is a summary of several of the most important bills WAM is tracking. Please note these are not all the bills we are following, but the ones that most directly affect our members. As noted, the full legislative summaries and bill status are on the WAM website.

House Joint Resolution HJ02

HJ02 is a joint resolution that would modify the Wyoming Constitution to remove the constitutional 4% limitation on debt for sewage disposal systems and replace it with a limit to be established by Wyoming voters. If approved, this issue would be placed on the statewide ballot in November 2020. This bill passed the House is awaiting action in the Senate. WAM supports this bill.

House Bill 66 - Statewide Lodging Tax

This bill would impose a 5% statewide lodging tax on short term lodging. Of this amount, 3% would be used to fund the Department of Tourism (effectively taking it out of the state general fund), and 2% would be distributed to the local governments. This bill passed the House this past week by a wide margin and is awaiting action in the Senate. WAM supports this bill.

House Bill 67 – Sales Tax Modifications

This bill would reduce the state sales tax by .5% and eliminate a number of sales tax exemptions. On January 22y, the House Appropriations Committee tabled this bill until further notice. Discussion/rumor around the capital is that it is going to come back with only the food exemption removed. It is WAM's understanding that there will be a means testing for lower income people that will allow them to be exempted from the tax. As noted, there is no official comment on this, but rather comments from some legislators involved in the revenue and appropriation process. WAM is monitoring this bill.

House Bill 69 – Marketplace Facilitators

This bill would effectively tax internet sales. As noted last week, it is estimated to generate \$3.5 million for local governments in FY 2020. This bill passed the House and is awaiting action in the Senate. WAM supports this bill.



House Bill 81 - Omnibus Water Bill - Planning

HB 81 funds a number of water projects around the state. The bill appropriates \$6.4 million from the Water Development Funds for planning of water projects around the state. Project details can be found in the bill. WAM supports this bill.

House Bill 93 – Tourism Improvement District

This bill authorizes counties, cities and towns to establish tourism improvement districts to fund specified tourism and marketing activities. It would require a majority vote of those in the established district. Only tourism related businesses would be assessed fees. Fees would be assessed on these tourism businesses and used for purposes identified by the oversight authority. The district could be used in lieu of or to supplement a lodging tax revenue. WAM supports this bill.

House Bill 95 – Specific Purpose Tax Excess Funds (SPTE)

This bill address how excess SPET funds are to be allocated. This bill was approved by the House Corporations Committee and is awaiting action in the House. WAM supports this bill.

House Bill 98 – Rights of Way Communication Services

This bill authorizes the use of rights of way for communication services, (telephone, internet, broadband, etc.). The bill acknowledges a statute change that communication companies are distinct from public utilities. This bill still requires a franchise agreement and allows for the imposition of a franchise fee. This bill passed the House is awaiting action in the Senate. WAM is monitoring this bill.

House Bill 105 - Municipal Services Recovery Action

The bill will preempt cities and towns who provide service (water, sewer, sanitation, etc.) to collect unpaid final bills from property owners. When a renter defaults on the fees, most cities/towns in Wyoming seek payment from the property owner. This bill has been referred to the House Corporations Committee. WAM opposes this bill.

House Bill 126 – Revenue Recalibration Task Force

This bill establishes a task force to work in the interim. The task force is charged with recommending standards and options for developing "a fair, viable and economically competitive state and local tax structure capable of generating sufficient revenues to meet the state's future, expected needs". The task force is directed to review the Tax Reform 2000 committee report. This bill has been introduced and waiting to be assigned to a committee. If the bill is introduced WAM will propose that a member of the task force represent municipalities. WAM supports this bill.



House Bill 138 – Sales Tax payments

This bill would use the 1% collection fee that the Department of Revenue receives that is deposited in the General Fund for administrating sales tax collections to create a reserve account of \$5 million. This new account would be used to repay cities, towns and counties when sales tax payments have been made to an incorrect entity. This bill was prompted by an incorrect payment to Natrona County and municipalities with in the county when it was due to Sweetwater County and municipalities within that county. All local governments that received the incorrect payments were required to repay the incorrect payment. The bill died in the House Revenue Committee. WAM supported the bill.

House Bill 146 – Local Government Publication Requirements

This bill modifies the publication requirements for local governments. It continues to require the publication of the salaries of public officials, but no longer requires that names of the officials be published. This passed House Corporations and is awaiting action in the House. WAM supports this bill.

House Bill 151 – Ban on Sanctuary Cities

This bill prohibits the implementation of immigration sanctuary policies by cities, towns and counties. If the bill passes it would withhold federal and state funds from a local government if the local government created a sanctuary city. This bill was heard by House Corporations Committee and passed 5-4 and is awaiting action in the House. WAM opposes this bill.

House Bill 179 - Food Truck Bill

This bill provides for the state to be the licensure of food trucks. It authorizes a licensee to operate a food truck "within any city, town or county in the state, including public rights of way". It restricts local governments from unduly interfering with the operation of food trucks, but does allow some limited regulation (reasonable time, place and manner) as necessary to provide for public health and safety. This bill has been introduced and referred to the House Corporations Committee. WAM opposes this bill.

HB 183 - Repeal of Gun Free Zones

This bill repeals the gun free zones established in previous legislation. This bill has been received for introduction but has not been assigned to a committee. It is like Senate File 75 which was not approved by the Senate Judiciary Committee this past week. An effort was made on the Senate floor to resurrect SF75 and have it assigned to another Senate Committee. After spirited debate the motion to reconsider failed 20-8 with 2 excused. WAM opposes both bills.



HB 188 – City and Town Zoning Protests

This bill modifies the requirements for protesting zoning changes in city or town regulations. It reduces the number of protests (from 20% to 10%) and increases the area considered immediately adjacent (from 140 feet to 200 feet). A protest would require 2/3 majority to be effective. WAM opposes this bill.

House Bill 196 – Local Regulation – Subdivisions

This bill would preempt Counties from establishing minimum lot sizes in family subdivisions. This bill does not affect cities and town's but is another local government preemption bill. WAM is monitoring this bill.

House Bill 201 – Cities and counties – publication of notices

This bill would allow cities, towns and counties to publish meeting minutes and ordinance titles on the city, town or county website instead of publishing them in the official newspaper. This bill has been introduced and referred to House Travel, Recreation and Tourism Committee. Expect a lively discussion from the Wyoming Press Association. WAM supports this bill.

House Bill 200 - Retail Fairness Act

This bill would impose an income tax on out of state corporations who do business in Wyoming. These corporations are domiciled in states (i.e. Walmart, Target, etc.) that have a state corporate income tax. Income from the Wyoming business are taxed in the home state, with no revenue going to Wyoming. This bill would require taxes be paid to Wyoming where the businesses conduct business in other states. This bill has passed 2nd reading in the House. This bill is expected to raise \$45 million in revenue and would go the School Foundation Fund. WAM supports this bill.

HB-206 - Video Skill Games.

This bill would allow establishments with liquor licenses and truck stops to install and operate video skill games. Each location could have up to 5 machines (amended to 2 this past week). The program would be administrated by the State Liquor Division. It is estimated that local governments would receive \$500,00 annually as provided by the vide skill game industry. Local governments cannot prohibit these machines anywhere in their community. Law enforcement lobby is strongly opposed to this bill. WAM is monitoring this bill.

House Bill 233 – State Income Tax

This bill would establish a statewide income tax for those with a taxable income of \$200,000 or more annually for individuals and businesses. It was heard by the House Revenue Committee this past week and died in the committee for lack of second to the motion. WAM will continue to monitor this bill if an effort is made for reconsideration.



<u>SF 20 – Surface Drainage Systems</u>

This bill grants cities and towns the authority to fund surface water drainage systems by service charges. This bill effectively allows a city or town to establish an enterprise fund to pay for storm water improvements. The bill was approved by the Senate Corporation Committee and was also approved by the Senate Committee of the Whole on first reading this past week. WAM supports this bill.

SF 48 - Unemployment Compensation

This bill allows an employer to apply to the Department of Work Force Services (DWFS) to be a designated seasonal employee and not be required to pay unemployment for seasonal workers when not justified. This bill was tabled indefinitely as the Department of Work Force Services stated it would cost \$700,000 to implement a software change to manage this portion of unemployment insurance. WAM was asked if municipalities would cost share in the estimated \$700,000, and responded no. WAM has worked on this topic for 7+ years, the reason for requesting a change in statute was to save money and it would ne counter intuitive to cost share, and WAM has stated that there is no reason to pay for services not provided. It is anticipated that the Senate Corporations Committee will address this bill one more time this session. WAM supports the bill, but not with the cost sharing concept.

SF 49 County Zoning - Schools

As note in the last update, this bill preempts the ability of counties to regulate private schools through county zoning regulations. This bill treats private school like public schools. This bill has passed the Senate and awaiting action in the House. WAM is monitoring this bill.

SF 57 – Public Records

This bill relates to the production of public records to include setting time limits for production, designating a public records person, provides for appeal processes, sets penalties including felonies for noncompliance to include termination of employment. The proposed bill causes numerous concerns for municipalities and many other entities. The bill has been amended to a point where we believe it is workable to include removal of severe penalties. A group of the entities drafted amendments to the bill and delivered to the Chairman of the Senate Corporations Committee that were adopted in an amended bill. WAM opposed the bill in its current form and will monitor the amended bill.

SF 75 - Repeal of Gun Free Zones

This bill repeals the gun free zones established in previous legislation. This bill was heard by the Senate Judiciary Committee this past week. The bill was defeated by a vote of the 3-2. An effort was made on the Senate floor to resurrect SF75 and have it assigned to another Senate



Committee. After spirited debate the motion to reconsider failed 20-8 with 2 excused. WAM opposes this bill.

<u>SF 79 - Employee Group Insurance – Local Governments</u>

This bill allows municipal and county employees to opt into the State Health Care plan. This bill was defeated in the Senate. WAM supported the bill.

Senate File 88 – Fireman's fund B

This bill reduces the amortization schedule for this fund from 40 years to 30 years. The bill proposes to increase the percentage contribution by the employer by 4% over a four-year time period. The Wyoming Retirement System states this is necessary to keep the fund adequately funded. This bill passed the Senate and is headed to the House. We have requested an amendment to would allow in the increase cost be divided between the employer and the employee. This is the method that was used when fiscal deficiencies in the General employee plan were addressed. WAM is monitoring this bill.

Senate File 100 – Firearms Preemption

This bill clarifies the applicability of the preemption of firearms regulation by the state as specified. WAM is monitoring this bill.

Subject: Supreme Court to Decide Fabrication of Evidence Case

HI all: The SLLC files an *amicus* brief in almost every Section 1983 case because state and local governments end up paying the money damages in these cases. So this case could be better (but no one died, a prosecutor not one of our direct members was the bad actor, etc.). But some good news here...I now have you up to date on all the grants of interest for this term (ending July 1). Long and short summaries are below.

The issue the Supreme Court will decide in <u>McDonough v. Smith</u> is whether the statute of limitations for a due process fabrication of evidence claim begins to run when the criminal proceedings terminate in the defendant's favor, or when the defendant becomes aware of the tainted evidence and its improper use.

Edward McDonough, former Democratic Commissioner of Rensselaer County Board of Elections, approved forged absentee ballot applications which he claims he didn't know had been falsified. Youel Smith investigated and prosecuted McDonough. McDonough claims Smith "engaged in an elaborate scheme to frame McDonough for the crimes by, among other things, fabricating evidence." After two trials, McDonough was ultimately acquitted.

Just before three years passed since McDonough was acquitted he sued Smith under Section 1983 for violating his due process rights by fabricating evidence and using it against him. Section 1983 allows citizens to sue state and local government officials in federal court for constitutional violations.

Section 1983 claims have a three-year statute of limitations. Smith claims that McDonough's claim is time barred because he failed to file his lawsuit within three years of *finding out* that Smith used fabricated evidence against him.

The Second Circuit held that McDonough's due process claim was time barred because the three-year statute of limitations started running when the fabricated evidence had been disclosed to him (as late as the end of his first trial), not on the day of his acquittal. McDonough argued his claim was most analogous to a malicious prosecution claim, which does not accrue until a favorable termination of the prosecution. But according to the Second Circuit: "Because the injury for this constitutional violation

occurs at the time the evidence is used against the defendant to deprive him of his liberty, whether it be at the time he is arrested, faces trial, or is convicted, it is when he becomes aware of that tainted evidence and its improper use that the harm is complete and the cause of action accrues. Indeed, the harm—and the due process violation—is in the *use* of the fabricated evidence to cause a liberty deprivation, not in the eventual resolution of the criminal proceeding."

Fabrication of evidence claims generally will be brought against prosecutors or state or local police officers. While the prosecutors or police officers are personally liable for money damages, their state and local government employers generally pay the damages. As a practical matter, the Second Circuit rule shortens the amount of time persons have to bring due process fabrication of evidence claims—which will make these claims easier for state and local governments to defend.
