Subject: Legion situation

Carter & Tim,

Updating you on the situation with the Legion renegotiation for the 2020 summer season. We have agreed on terms as spelled out in the attached letter:

1. A \$15,000 cash payment in lieu of the contracted marketing payment agreement of approximately \$65,000;
2. 35% of our ticket income for the 2020 season;
3. Continuing the physical plant operation agreement (utility splits, field maintenance, etc.).

We have been dealing with their attorney, Ryan Ford, on this. We agreed to the \$15,000 cash payment but asked that it be broken into three payments of \$5,000, as our cash flow at this time is zero due to the pandemic. They are demanding the \$15,000 be paid in full by May 1. I simply cannot do that.

We have paid them more than \$125,000 over the past two years just in the marketing reimbursement, and are not behind on any payments to them prior to 2020. Neither the Horseheads or the Legion knows at this point if the pandemic will allow us to play the summer season at all. We intend to play, but will likely have a late start and play later into August.

They have threatened eviction proceedings starting May 1 if we do not pay the entire \$15,000 by that date. I have no doubt, after dealing with these people for nearly three years, that they would proceed, no matter how it looks to the public, media, City or anyone else.

I don't know what you can do to help in this situation but it seems all we are stuck on is making payments on a reimbursement the Legion may not even be due if they do not play.

Any ideas you have would be very helpful. If you would like to discuss this in a phone call that would be good as well.

Re: Correspondence Regarding Sublease Agreement with Casper Legion Baseball Club, Inc.

Mr. Heeman:

Thank you for your proposal, dated April 16, 2020, regarding the payment issues with the Sublease Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "Sublease").

Please be advised that Casper Legion Baseball Club, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Legion"), is not comfortable with the propositions as set forth by the Casper Horseheads Baseball Club (hereinafter referred to as "CHBC"). Please be further advised that, as of April 20, 2020, CHBC has failed to cure the material breach of the Sublease (which was the subject of a demand to cure letter which was addressed to your attention on April 4, 2020).

Based on the failure to cure, Legion is in a position to terminate the Sublease and have CHBC removed from the premises. However, Legion would like to see CHBC have a season and have the ability to recognize some gain on the current agreement between the parties. As a result, Legion proposes the following:

- In lieu of the Sublease Fees of \$64,596 (as contemplated by Section 3(A) of the Sublease), CHBC is to pay to Legion the amount of \$15,000.00 on or before May 1, 2020;
- To recapture as much of the reduced/lost sublease fees as possible, CHBC shall issue to Legion 35% of the gross gate proceeds for the entirety of the 2020 playing season (this payment must be calculated based on the paid attendance as reported to

CHBC's league headquarters and must be paid to Legion by Wednesday of the week following CHBC's home stand); and

- CHBC is to remain current on all other financial obligations of the Sublease Agreement.

Should CHBC be in agreement with the above terms and conditions, this proposal must be accepted, in writing, by 5:00 PM on April 24, 2020. Failure to accept this proposal shall result in the immediate termination of the Sublease. In addition, failure to provide the above-stated payments on a timely basis shall result in the immediate termination of the Sublease.

Please also note, this is simply an attempt by Legion to permit CHBC to have a 2020 season in Casper. As you are aware, pursuant to Section 23 of the Sublease, by extending the above-referenced considerations, Legion in no way waives the breaches of CHBC and Legion expressly reserves the rights to collect on any and all amounts which may be due and owing under the terms and conditions of the Sublease. Consequently, as addressed in prior correspondence, there shall be no automatic extension of the term of the Sublease into 2021.

We don't "see it happening". We don't really see the big picture. We don't make the connection that it does no good for our city to be "open" if a large percentage of the population is seriously ill. Too many people are making that individual rights and government overreach argument. They don't see that, if they understood community spread and took appropriate measures, there would (in theory) be no need for government intrusion. My opinion is that better education is needed as to the reason for the shutdown, and along with that, better education on what each individual can do,, AND WHY, which would allow us to re-open more quickly. Somehow the whole community spread issue isn't really sinking in with a large number of people. But it sure has sunk in with things like wasting disease, carp in the fisheries, non native plant species in the ag lands. So what if the issue was framed by analogy in those more Wyoming terms with which everyone is familiar?. Somehow Game and Fish and Weed and Pest have done great jobs of education on those issues and gotten darn near every Wyomingite to understand, and for the most part, respect the actions we need to take to keep those community spread threats under control. Seems to me if we could put out some form of public education using those or similar issues as an analogy, we could get even more people on board with actually supporting the essentials of social distancing, rather than just paying lip service to compliance. The more people we get on board with truly understanding the "why" and understanding the consequences, the faster we can re-open businesses etc with some assurance that enough people will take the steps necessary to keep Wyoming a relatively safe place. And this type of education could be done very quickly via posts on social media, TV interviews, even a bulk mailing to every city address. The more people who really "get the picture" about how community spread works and HOW QUICKLY it works, the more sensibly they will behave in businesses and public places, and the faster all those places can re-open.

My employees are lucky enough that they are w2 employees and those of them that have been able to get ahold of unemployment have gotten that benefit. I have also had the blessing of the Payroll Protection Program that will pay my employees for a month or so and keep my building running while down. Our situation is very different from single booth studio salons. A lot of those girls/guys are usually working alone already. I believe that for them to reopen is very simple. One client in at a time, 10-15 minutes of proper sanitizing, then their next client. This is a stylists only form of income, a lot of them with families to provide for. As far as my type of salon with a larger amount of employees, there should be larger stipulations. If we are aloud to reopen May 1, 2020 I would have my employees pick days of the week to work and would have to alternate. I would only allow one stylist in at a time as if they were in their own studio. One client in, sanitize, next client. My massage therapist has her own room where she can stay and take one client at a time as well, I would not allow her to "mingle" in the hair styling area. My esthetician also has her own room where the same rules would apply. She would be required to stay in that room seeing one client at a time and not in the common areas. Ontop of the rules I would require my employees to wear a mask at all times during work for a certain amount of time and our clients would be obligated to be wearing a mask as well. I have even gotten bulk masks ordered to have for sale at the salon when we can reopen, just in case a client does not have one. I appreciate all that is being done and cannot imagine being in the footsteps of the leaders and groups in these task forces. Comments	<p>Prepared for Natrona County EOC and city of Casper Contact Service Industry Re-opening Ideas (Salons, Spas, Barber, Tattoo, and Massage Shops) Hand Washing: Follow CDC guidelines on hand washing with warm water for 20 to 30 seconds with bubbles filling hands making sure to do thumb tips and wringing fingertips into palms. Make sure you have covered all surfaces of hands with bubbles and friction action and remember it is that friction and the bubbles that are loosening and pulling dirt and debris from your hands to then be rinsed down the drain. Using a nonporous brush such as a nail or nylon brush is great but it must be disinfected after each use. Hand washing is mandatory after using restroom, eating or smoking. You should be washing before and after each client. Do not use antibacterial hand soap unless it's all you have. Antibacterial soap does not kill bacteria it just slows down how quickly you produce (good) bacteria. It knocks off good bacteria from your hands and leaves opening or space for bad bacteria to replace it. Antibacterial soap also does not say it kills viruses and could cause issues in women's health because of the fact it is made with triclosan. Hand Sanitizers: Hand sanitizers should be used in a manner that the entire hands become wet when using a gel hand sanitizer (2 full pumps at minimum) and the hands should be rubbed with friction for 20 to 30 seconds. There may be some dripping of product. Hand sanitizer is a good option when proper washing is not available and at minimum we want all clients to sanitize hands upon entry of business. Better if the client could wash hands prior to us touching them and then professional should also follow with a hand sanitizer especially for nail services. Extra precautions are good for all involved. Gloves: New gloves should be worn by professionals while giving services although it is important to remember that petroleum based gloves should not be worn when using petroleum based products as this will leave micro holes that will expose hands. It is also important to remember that if you are touching surfaces that are contaminated and then touch your eyes nose or mouth the gloves are of no use. Disinfection Disinfection should be done properly to all implements and surfaces that have come into or will be in contact with a client. Disinfection should be done according to manufacturer's instructions and in accordance of state statutes and rules of Wyoming Boards of Cosmetology and Barbering. All disinfectants have a contact time on the label and implements should be completely immersed and surface areas should stay wet with disinfectant for the proper contact time. In the contact service industry we would like things to be cleaned well and then sprayed or wiped until saturated (wet) with disinfectant for contact time on label. Most are 10 minutes! Bleach as a disinfectant: First all disinfecting bleach has an expiration date of 6 months from time of manufacturing that is printed on the bottle by day</p>

of the year and the year. This is a hard number to understand and is misleading to the general public. Second not all bleach can be used as a disinfectant for example in the Clorox family only the blue bottle that says disinfecting bleach may be used as a disinfectant. Fragranced and non-splash bleach are NOT disinfecting, please read your labels. Mixed properly bleach labeled disinfecting bleach may be used as a disinfectant on non-porous surfaces but may be an unstable disinfectant and lose some efficacy in a 24 hour period. Remember that bleach needs a water mixture to be a disinfectant and hot water separates bleach and makes it ineffective as a disinfectant. When mixing bleach as a disinfectant, do NOT use hot water.

Linens and paper barriers for client protection: This brings us to the washing machine, don't waste bleach for disinfection in a washer with hot water thinking that will better disinfect items. The heat of the dryer is what will kill unwanted bacteria, fungi and viruses. Make sure all laundry is hot to the touch when coming out of the dryer and you will be much safer. Think of the washer as cleaning and the drying as killing unwanted items. Standard washers are not hot enough to kill all bacteria fungi and viruses Remember the regulations say that you must disinfect chairs and beds between each client but do not regulate what those service chairs and beds are made of. Normal or common beds and chairs are made of a fake leathery type material that is actually porous and we should (per law) spray or wipe them as usual with disinfectant but we should all be looking for a nonporous surface product in the future. Paper and linen coverings do help create a barrier from these types of fabric/faux leather. Launder any linen and throw away paper between clients. All industries including dental and healthcare should be looking toward a better surface for our clients in the future that are non-porous and can actually be disinfected. Drapes for barbering and hairstyling should no longer be allowed to rely on paper neck strips. Every client should receive a clean drape. This has been the case for quite some time and all regulators should remove the rules of neck strips and require a clean drape for every client as the cape is coming into contact with the client in more than the neck region of a client. Neck strips may still be used but should no longer be thought of as a client protection device. Establishments Point of Check in and Client Waiting Area: All magazines or books of shared use should be removed until further notice from regulators. There should be no testers available to clients such as lotions or samples that may be handled or used by clients. If possible all clients should have temperature taken with a no touch temperature device upon arrival. They should then be asked to wash hands or use hand sanitizer and given a mask and gloves if available to wear while being serviced. Be mindful that if local medical workers do not have proper PPE you should not waste PPE on clientele. Professionals should keep a list of all clients and staff that includes time of arrival and departure in order to help with contact tracing information. Clients should not be scheduled to arrive at the same time so that we can maintain social distancing in waiting areas. If possible clients should not sit or wait but be greeted and logged in with time and temperature and taken directly to their service area and seated on clean disinfected chair or bed. If there are multiple locations for service like shampoo areas then the actual service area please take client to first location of service to be properly draped and prepared for service. Create an appointment venue for clients. This will be particularly harder for many Barber shops as they are accustomed to the first come first serve business model. There are multiple apps to help with scheduling and providing clients with a phone to schedule will be important in this time. If clients are going to be in a waiting area make sure they are social distancing and to disinfect that area between each waiting client. All establishments should arrange special times for clients that are 60 years of age and older or clients with preexisting issues in order to better protect those individuals. Point of Check out: If taking a credit card the client should read to professional the numbers of card to be keyed into credit card machine and not have client handle credit card machine. By manually entering the number the client will not need to sign and this will eliminate one thing that multiple people are handling. This may cost a bit more but will be worth it if it keeps germs from spreading. If Cash is passed it must be followed by

thorough hand washing and disinfection of hand washing sink handles or disposal of gloves worn during exchange. Remember to disinfect all things a client has touched including door handles on a regular basis. Phones in establishment should be disinfected after every use and if possible be limited to one person. It is recommended that instead of answering every call that comes in that on your phone message you tell clients that they will be called back in the order they have left messages and then one person handle getting messages and doing call backs to clients for scheduling in intervals convenient to establishment. We do not want multiple people answering phones without disinfection between handling the phone. Social Distancing within an establishment: It is impossible to social distance with in a contact service establishment between the professional and the client but we can social distance between professionals and between clients. This should happen by separating stations to six feet apart and or staggering times of when each professional takes clients. When services are done in one room per client areas like many estheticians or more likely a tattoo professional and most likely a massage therapist then you are good. Hair shaving and nail areas with multiple clients in one room will need to take more precautions and create social distancing or staggered scheduling. We suggest the following as a result of this situation. Washing hands properly and preset applications/products prior to donning gloves. Wear gloves while performing services. Wear a mask while performing services. Take temperatures upon arrival of clients and professionals. Keep a contact tracing log of clients and professionals arrival and departure times. Disinfect all implements and surfaces that come into contact with clients' skin according to manufacturer's directions. Read all manufacturers' directions when protecting public safety. Dry all linens on hot. Schedule clients in a staggered manner to avoid overlap. Limit number of people in contact with phone and registers. Become Barbicide certified at barbicide.com Rocky Mountain Academy of Hair Skin and Nails requires all graduates to become Barbicide certified at barbicide.com and recommend that anyone in the contact service industries do the same. We promise you will learn something. Our lead Instructor has experienced lung issues previously and we want to protect our business as well as our instructors, students and clients. Public Protection and Elected Officials It should be said that licensed Cosmetology, Barbering, Hair Styling, Esthetics, and Nail technology professionals have all been properly educated and examined for licensure on proper disinfection and client safety and all are inspected annually by the state of Wyoming to make sure they have and are properly using EPA registered disinfectants as well as protecting clients health safety and welfare. Although the state legislature does not find it important to license massage or tattoo parlors/shops Laramie County does and Natrona County most certainly should. These professionals are in direct contact with our citizens. This pandemic is a perfect example of why regulation should happen and our elected representatives on a city county and state level should act on this ASAP. Now is the time to better protect the health safety and welfare of all citizens'. Failure to license contact service industries is mistake by government officials. Contact services should be held at a higher standard with inspections and licensure.
