We're making progress

DWS continues to work hard to get the people of Wyoming who have lost their jobs due to COVID-19 back to work. Our unemployment rate has continued to decline since it hit its peak in April, but we know there are still a great many Wyoming workers who are having trouble finding work.

For the week ending Oct. 10, 2020, we saw 1,080 initial claims for Unemployment Insurance (UI) and 8,456 continued claims. Though UI claims are down from their highest point during the pandemic, they are still higher than last year. For the same week in 2019, we received 467 initial claims and had 1,668 continued claims.

We continue to offer assistance to everyone seeking employment, as well as to businesses looking for workers. Our 20 Workforce Centers throughout the state are open, and we stand ready to help Wyoming's workers find work.

We will get through this together.
